As far as I know, Windows XP Service Pack 2's Firewall doesn't have a serial number; it uses your Windows XP serial number for verification purposes, as part of Service Pack 2. Are you running some sort of outside Firewall? Or do you perhaps mean a router of some kind?
If you meant a router -- "A device in a network that handles message transfer between computers" -- then I suggest you do a little research on that type of computer hardware. Your router's serial number should be listed right on the hardware, generally on the bottom. Once you have the brand name and the serial number, a Google search should help.
If you're running some sort of application Firewall -- "Any of a number of security schemes that prevent unauthorized users from gaining access to a computer network or that monitor transfers of information to and from the network." -- then I suggest you hit the Firewall's personal website. ZoneAlarm's website, for example, can be found at <http://www.zonelabs.com/>. Again, a Google search might also prove fruitful.
