No, that's not what I said. What I said is having a 64bit processor does not *necessarily* mean all your hardware supports 64bit, but it's probable that it does if the processor does, I just meant you shouldn't assume.

Your operating system says 32bit because a 32bit version was installed, there's no switch to flip between 64bit and 32bit versions of Windows, you have to actually reinstall the whole operating system to change, hence why you can find 32bit versions of Windows running on 64bit hardware.
