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WinME only 'support' 512mb... you can install more, but you should declare this extra ram as a fix value for the vcache in your system.ini

[vcache]

minfilecache=your extramemory (e.g. for 128mb use $128 * 1024 = 131072$)

maxfilecache=same as above

HTH
