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FFS, I submitted a long post to this thread yesterday, and it hasn't came through. It came up with page cannot be displayed, and I couldn't get back to the reply box.

Anyway, here it is summarised. First, open up microsoft config (msconfig) from the run box, go to the startup tab, turn off everything except scanregistry, taskmonitor, systemtray and loadpowerprofile. Now, right click your desktop, go to properties, settings tab, advanced box. Find the #d settings for your card and turn the detail stuff down if you can. There might be a folder in start > programs called Nvidia, geforce or whatever that lets you do the same thing. Now, right click My Computer, properties, find the device manager, disk drives, right click the one you use, properties, settings tab and enable DMA (direct memory access). Finally, create a folder on your desktop called "textures" and shift all texture modifications in your renegade\data folder into it. AT LAST, restart. Try the game now. Still slow? Try a driver update from http://www.nvidia.com. Your main problem is probably your processor speed.
