Then you save it as an image, gif, jpeg, png, whatever, then you slice it. I use Macromedia fireworks to slice layouts, then export as HTML. However, you have to be careful while slicing it, otherwise it will not expand properly, or you may not be able to repeat an image to reduce loading time on your pages (I've made that mistake plenty of times).
