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Hi!

I first want to say that i played Renegade for years, using RG since it came out. Now i did two things:

1. I bought "The First Decade"
2. I bought a new computer.

I installed TFD and first tried to play red alert. I had to install the old "Westwood chat" for this reason.

Then, a few days later, i installed renguard, then started renegade. The renguard window told me "No WOL name found, connecting will probably fail" and nothing else happened. I closed the window about 10 min later.

I started game2 exe - chose "internet - westwood online" and it told me my version of WOL was not compatible with this game - i had to reinstall.

I reinstalled ONLY westwood shared internet components from my old Renegade - CD.

i tried it again with game2.exe - it worked. Then i started game.exe.

Only a blank window with the title "renguard 1.03" appeared (see attachment) - nothing else happened. I could only close the window with the error message "...is not responding etc."

I uninstalled, reinstalled etc. Nothing changed.

Can anyone help me with this?

Before anyone asks for that:

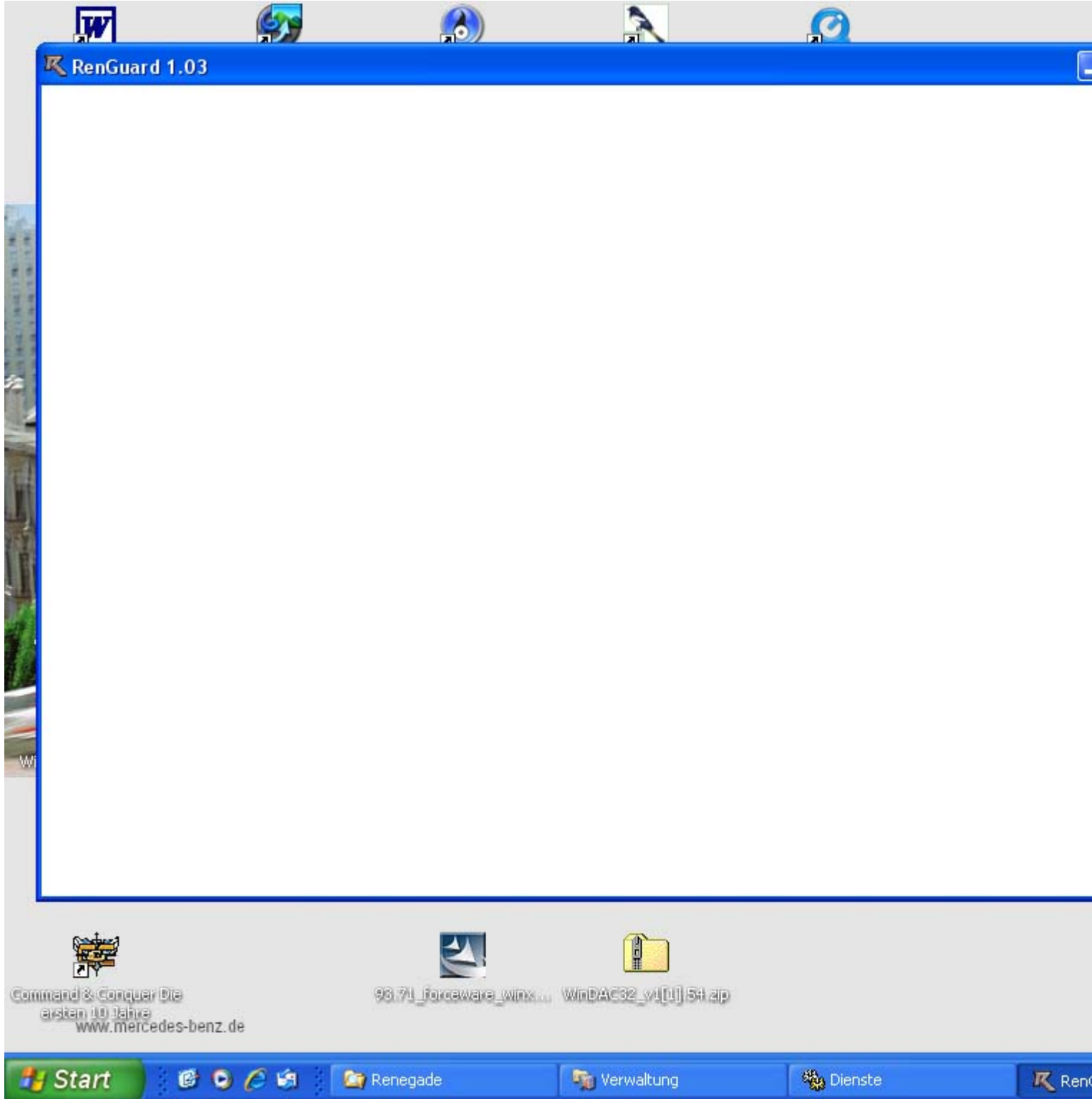
- I have read all the other topics
