I think I have the solution for you. Since we both have Creative sound cards, the control panel

should technically be the same. Here is what the mixer panel looks like for me:

Make sure the "Microphone" slider is all the way down, or just muted. That is the volume for microphone playback, which is what you're experiencing. I'm sure common sense can tell you what the other microphone slider on the right does. Hope that helps.

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
