Ubuntu ran good from the CD, but after installing, I got screwed there, luckily i installed on a external HDD, Partition your HD to like 100 gig for linux and the other for file storage if you want to use it as a HDD still, otherwise if you partition the entire drive and install linux over it all, then your screwed, cause it's file format will be unrecognized by windows as a external HDD. 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That's the problem with Linux, things don't work the right way straight away, and new users don't know how to make them right.

For instance, I daresay your bitdepth and resolution problems were simply because the wrong defaults were set in the xorg.conf file. I know this because my first experience with Ubuntu had the same problem, and I had to search the internet for a good while to find out the solution.
