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Depending on why your trying to do it, and who your trying to hide it from, you could simply create a partition to store 'hidden' things on, and then disable it from showing up in Windows Explorer using the NoDrives registry key. It's fairly well hidden from the casual observer, but it's not going to stop someone who knows what they are doing from getting to it (since you just manually type the drive letter into the address bar to get to it). Again, depends on the scenario and whom it is you want to hide it from.

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Why don't you just edit the NTFS permissions of the folders in question and delete the permission entries for the Everyone group and any other users, leaving just your personal account with access? Then, assuming you don't give anyone your password, leave the machine logged in or give out admin rights to everyone, the folder is fairly secure.
