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I am using leveledit, I have tried both versions (stock and Jonwil). Neither of these displays the scripts when I go to "add".

I have 3.4.4 installed(TFD), it works fine ingame. However, despite having scripts, scripts2 and bhs.dll in /renegade /data /leveledit/(modname/ /leveledit/(modname)/scripts and fake westwood renegade directories (and a few reinstalls) the scripts drop-down selection is empty... I've already fixed the missing presets tree stuff (changing the registry entry and adding in the missing (tm)), looked on renhelp.net and searched here. If anybody could give me a quick hand with this I'd be most grateful.

Oh yay! I just discovered I can't edit the strings either >.< whoop de doo! This is going well...

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I would strongly suggest you use JonWil's leveledit.
It isn't working right because you have 'The First Decade' version of renegade. You'll have to apply a registry fix in order to get it to work.
