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Here's a little tip on mining.Place and space them strategically.Don't just pile them up. If you space them out a little bit the person or persons will trigger one and then run into another and BOINK! If they're in a pile they'll all go off at once and the 2nd person gets in damage free. Also remember Remote C-4 count towards the 30 mine limit. So don't pile up a bunch of remote c-4 and wait for the enemy to come so you can blow them up. If anything it only takes one or two remote c-4 at most to kill someone. Hope this helps someone new.

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
