The actual games, however, are - you guessed it - 32-bit (excepting the one that is actually specified as DOS of course). If you can get the game installed, then you'll be able to run it. Problem solved with red alert:

to get this to work simply use these instructions  
and use the Red Alert Setup Manager v0.98 tool.

also your going to need to use C&C gold XP patch  
run the game in compatibility mode for 98/me and it should work fine

the freeware version is required

edit:

Tiberian Dawn solved as well:  
this is even more simple

just download and use this  
Then use the C&C gold XP patch

and lastly if you are using windows 7 64 bit you MUST have these EXACT settings in compatibility mode or the game will keep kicking back to the desktop.

edit 2: if your having inverted color problems just have the screen resolution page in control panel open in the background
