Google something like change dns servers in windows" and the version (XP, Vista, 7, whatever) and change the DNS addresses to something else. For testing purposes, you could try google's DNS: 8.8.8.8 and 8.8.4.4. You can also change the addresses in your modem/router if you can find where they are.

It's worked well for me, but I don't know of any equivalents for the Netherlands though.
