Active PFC doesn't have anything to do with the amounts of rails.

And either way, if you do not short circuit your stuff, you do want one rail instead of more.

Otherwise it can happen that the OCP kicks in on one rail (meaning instant shutdown) while another one is barely loaded. With one rail you don't have this issue.

Problem with that is that the PSU needs to be very well designed and needs some expensive parts to cope with the high current.
